

Chemical Fertilizers Control (Licence) Regulations 1980.

GN No. 43 of 1980.

Regulations made by the Minister under section 10 of the Chemical Fertilizers Control Act 1978

1. These regulations may be cited as **the Chemical Fertilizers Control (Licence) Regulations 1980.**
2. In these regulations-
 - "Act" means the Chemical Fertilizers Control Act;
 - "applicant" means a person who applies to the Chief Agricultural Officer for a licence;
 - "licence" means a licence granted under section 3 of the Act.
3. Every application for a licence shall be-
 - (1) made in writing to the Chief Agricultural Officer and shall include-
 - (a) the name and address of the applicant;
 - (b) whether a wholesaler or retailer licence is being applied for;
 - (c) the fertilizers in respect of which the application is made;
 - (d) the address of the premises in respect of which the application is made.
 - (2) signed, in the case of an individual, by the applicant or, in the case of any other person, by such person authorised to sign on behalf of the applicant.
 - (3) accompanied by such written information which satisfies the Chief Agricultural Officer that-
 - (a) chemical fertilizers may safely be sold on the premises in respect of which the application is made;
 - (b) arrangements have been made to store fertilizers separate from food stuffs;
 - (c) in the case of an applicant for a retailer licence, separate scales have been provided exclusively for the weighing of fertilizers.
4. (1) A licence shall-
 - (a) be in the form set out in the First Schedule; and
 - (b) subject to paragraph (3), be granted on payment of the fee specified in the second Schedule .
 - (2) Every licence, unless previously revoked or suspended, shall-
 - (a) be valid for a period of 12 months;
 - (b) Subject to paragraph (3), be renewable on payment of the appropriate fee specified in the Second Schedule.

(3) No fee shall be payable for the grant or renewal of a licence in respect of any co-operative society.

5. (1) Where the conditions of a licence are amended during its currency, a new licence, including the amended conditions shall be granted to the licensee.

(2) The Minister may, where he is satisfied that a licence has been destroyed, lost or defaced and on payment of the prescribed fee, grant to the licensee a duplicate licence.

This licence is granted subject to the following conditions

- (a) the licence shall not be transferred or assigned to another person;
 - (b) the licensee shall store the chemical fertilizers separate from food stuffs;
 - (c) the licensee, in the case of a retailer, shall use separate scales exclusively for the purpose of weighing fertilizers.
